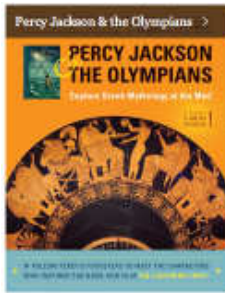


Did you know that **ART** is... greek pottery? Check out below how the Art Appreciation Committee and your
